- Sustainable communities.




We have looked at our Wellbeing objectives to make sure they are meeting these challenges.

Objective 1: Conservation



We want to stop things getting worse and make sure the biodiversity is better.

We want to make sure nature is flourishing in the National Park.



Biodiversity means: having a lot of different plants and animals together.

It is important for nature to have good biodiversity.

We will do this by:



 Stopping things getting worse now and then making sure there is more biodiversity. This is important on land and at sea.



• Manage more land for conservation.





We can do this for land we own and we can support other people to manage their land for nature.

• To link nature and conservation areas across the National Park.



• To support a wide range of people to take part in action for nature.

Objective 2: Climate



We want to make the authority carbon neutral by 2030. We want to support the National Park to be carbon neutral.



We will make sure the National Park is prepared for climate change.

Carbon neutral

Fossil fuels like gas and coal make harmful gases. Carbon neutral means making sure we do the least harm when we use fossil fuels. We can do this by:

- using less energy.
- Using carbon free energy like wind and solar.
- Planting trees and supporting others to plant trees.

We will do this by:




• Making the authority carbon neutral by 2030.



 Supporting the National Park to become more carbon neutral by 2040.








 Working with our staff and the public to change how people think and act about climate change.
