Ash	Fraxinus excelsior	Woodland / Hedgerow / Shelter	Although native, it is presently advised that Ash is omitted from planting schemes. Refer to <i>Plant Health (Wales) (Amendment) Order 2013</i>
Aspen	Populus tremula	Woodland / Hedgerow / Shelter	
Bog myrtle	Myrica gale	Wetland / Moorland / Garden	
Broom	Cytisus scoparius	Coastal / Hedgerow / Garden	
Blackthorn	Prunus spinosa	Woodland / Hedgerow / Shelter	
Crab Apple	Malus sylvestris	Woodland / Hedgerow / Garden	
Dogwood	Thelycrania sanguinea	Woodland / Hedgerow / Garden	Only native in a few areas in the South, including Pembroke River and Bosherston Also known as Cornus sanguinea
Downy Birch	Betula pubescens	Woodland / Garden / Shelter	Birch is absent from the St Davids Peninsular
Eared willow	Salix aurita	Wetland / Coastal / Moorland	
Elder	Sambucus nigra	Hedgerow / Garden / Shelter	
Gorse	Ulex europaeus/gallii	Upland / Coastal / Hedgerow	
Goat willow	Salix caprea	Woodland / Wetland / Hedgerow	
Grey willow	Salix atrocinerea	Wetland / Hedgerow / Shelter	
Guelder rose	Viburnum opulus	Woodland / Hedgerow / Garden	Guelder Rose is Absent from West Pembrokeshire
Hawthorn	Crataegus monogyna	Woodland / Hedgerow / Garden	
Hazel	Corylus avellana	Woodland / Hedgerow / Garden	
Holly	llex aquifolium	Woodland / Hedgerow / Garden

Juniper	Juniperus communis	Coastal / Garden	Very Limited species of relict coastal distribution Do not plant on the coast outside gardens
Rowan	Sorbus aucuparia	Woodland / Hedgerow / Garden	
Sessile oak	Quercus petraea	Woodland / Hedgerow / Shelter	
Silver Birch	Betula pendula	Woodland / Garden / Shelter	Birch is absent from the St Davids Peninsular Do not plant here as it is very invasive on lowland heath
Spindle	Euonymus europaeus	Hedgerow / Woodland	South – species generally found to South of Landsker line
Wayfaring tree	Viburnum lantana	Woodland / Shelter / Garden	Only Native in one small area down river of Pembroke Castle
Wild cherry	Prunus avium	Woodland / Hedgerow / Garden	
Wild privet	Ligustrum vulgare	Coastal / Hedgerow / Garden	
Wild service tree	Sorbus torminalis	Woodland / Hedgerow	Restricted – Main Population around Cleddau estuary
Wych elm	Ulmus glabra	Woodland / Hedgerow	

Beech (Fagus Sylvatica) and Sycamore (Acer pseudoplatanus) are common in Pembrokeshire; having become naturalised over the past few hundred years, however it is NOT recommended that these and other non-native species are planted adjacent to existing semi-natural broadleaved woodland species where they could become invasive, thus altering the natural structure of the native woodland communities.
