The following draft Supplementary Planning Guidance was approved for public consultation by the National Park Authority on 26 June 2013.

The consultation began in August 2013 and ended on 1st November 2013.

About 800 letters were sent to consultees on the Local Development Plan database, and an email consultation for those expressing this preference. The consultees were informed that a CD of the consultation documents could be made available free of charge and the documents were available for download from the Authority's web site. Paper copies of the Supplementary Planning Guidance were made available on request at a minimum fee.

Letters and CDs of the consultation documents were provided to libraries within Pembrokeshire and at St Clears and Cardigan as follows

They were also provided to the National Park Authority centres at Newport, St Davids and Tenby. Paper copies of the documents were available to view at the National Park Offices in Llanion Park, Pembroke Dock.

CDs containing the documents were provided to City, Town and Community Councils within the National Park. The opportunity was also provided for Councils to request a free paper copy of the guidance. A freepost envelope was provided to encourage this. Any documents were subsequently provided to City, Town and Community Councils at no cost to the Councils.

The consultation was advertised via the Authority's web site and via public notices in the Western Telegraph which appeared on the 7th August 2013. Towards the end of the consultation we also placed reminders in the Tenby Observer, Friday October 18th 2013, the Western Telegraph, Wednesday October 16th 2013, the Tivyside Advertiser, Tuesday October 22nd 2013 and the Pembrokeshire Herald, Friday October 18th 2013. Pembrokeshire Radio also advertised the consultation. As at 15th October 2013 660 individuals saw the 'post' the Authority made on Facebook regarding the consultation. It was also advertised on Twitter. The consultation was advertised via the Authority's web site and via a public notice in the Western Telegraph on 25 July 2012.

All responses were acknowledged, and are publicly available - see web link below. A total of 28 organisations/individuals responded and made 172 individual comments of support.

The officer responses to the consultation on the Supplementary Planning Guidance were reported to the National Park Authority at its meeting on 11 December 2013. A report of the officer responses to the supplementary planning guidance consultation can be viewed using the following weblink:
