LOOK OUT FOR: Buzzards • views from Foel Eryr

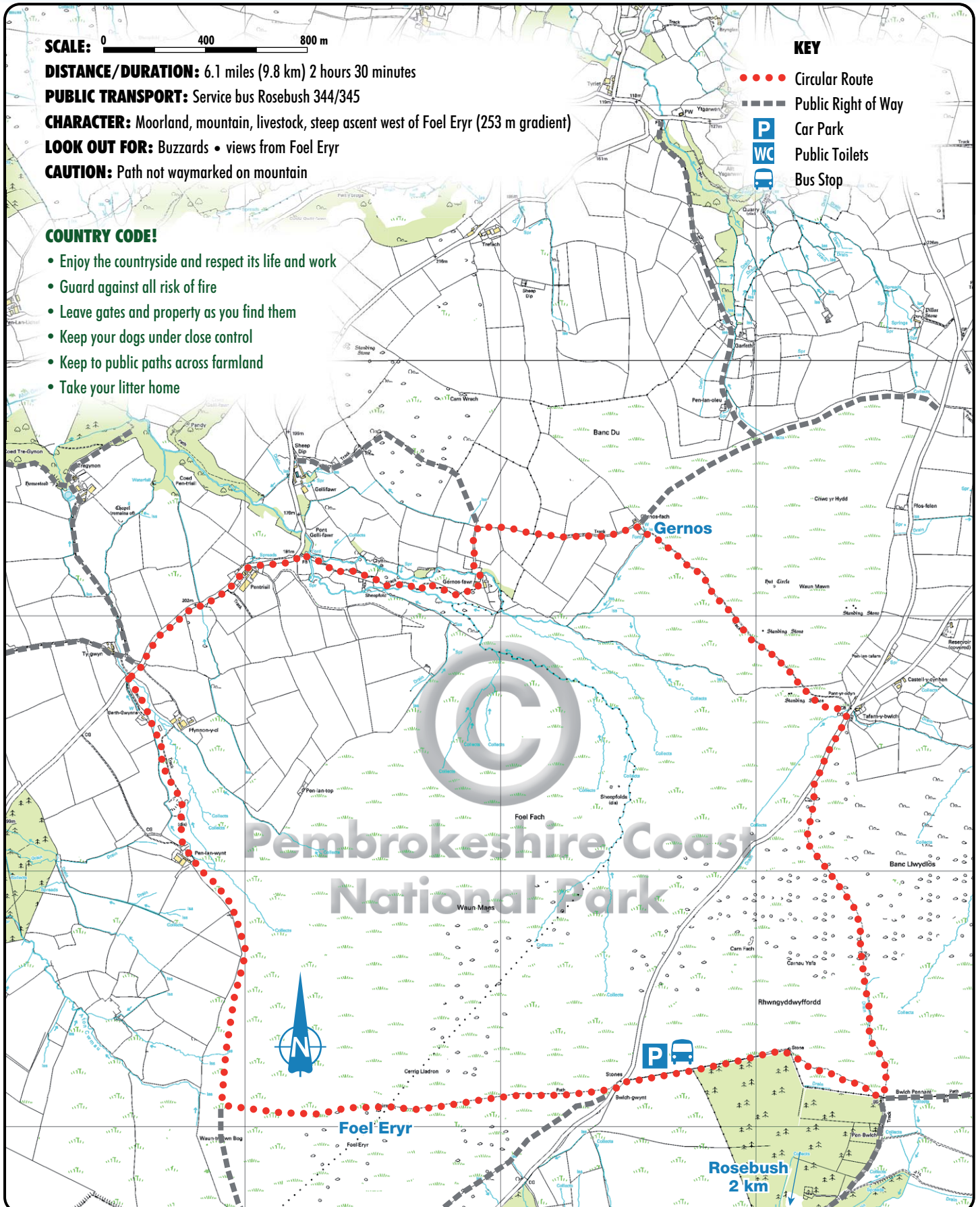

Look out for: Buzzards, views.

A large hut, drystone enclosure complex and a Bronze Age burial cairn grace Foel Eyr as well as a National Park observation beacon, which points out the different sights to be seen from this spectacular viewpoint over the Park. Look out for moorland birds like buzzard, kestrel, raven and skylark.
