

Short Walk

Duration: 1 hour 30 minutes

Length: 2.7 miles (4.3 km)

Public transport: Service bus Dinas/Fishguard 412, *Poppit Rocket

405 (*seasonal, hail & ride).

Grid ref: SM985381

Aberbach is a small, beautifully secluded pebble beach framed by low (100 ft) cliffs pocked with tiny coves and caverns.

Look out for: Sea birds, views.

The area is widely used by kayakers and there are striking views out to sea and inland to the tors of Carn Bica and Carn Gelli rising above the village of Penrhyn.

Located between Dinas Island and Fishguard this stretch of coast is great for sea birds; look for gulls, ravens, choughs and peregrines on the cliffs with the occasional cormorant, razorbill, guillemot and gannet. Spring squill, buckshorn plantain, vetch and thyme are some of the plants that are able to grow well in the thin soil at the top of the cliff.

Character: Rugged coast, cliff edge, lanes, reasonably level, 600 m on minor road.
