## **REPORT OF PLANNING OFFICER (PARK DIRECTION)**

#### SUBJECT: RESPONSE TO WELSH GOVERNMENT CONSULTATION ON DRAFT TECHNICAL ADVICE NOTE (TAN) 23 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

#### Purpose of the report

To consider and approve the Authority's response to the Welsh Government's consultation on a new draft Technical Advice Note (TAN) 23 relating to Economic Development.

#### Background

Planning Policy Wales sets out the land use planning policies of the Welsh Government, supplemented by a series of TANs which together provide the framework for the preparation of the Local Development Plan and decision-making responsibilities of Local Planning Authorities.

The Welsh Government has published a draft Technical Advice Note to support planning policy on Economic Development set out in chapter 7 of Planning Policy Wales (November 2012). The TAN focusses principally on the provision of traditional employment uses B1 to B8.<sup>1</sup>

#### Draft TAN23

Whilst Chapter 7 of Planning Policy Wales emphasises the importance of recognising the whole economy's contribution to economic growth, the draft TAN focusses principally on the provision of traditional employment uses B1 to B8.

Local Development Plans are required to be based on a robust evidence base and the TAN proposes that the structure of this evidence in relation to economic development consists of 2 parts:

- A broad overview of the whole economy to inform an economic vision for the plan; and
- A closer analysis of B Class uses to inform detailed policy.

The evidence should be provided firstly by a regional study and then by local study incorporating an Employment Land Review. (The details of this requirement will be published in separate guidance later in the year).

The need to set the development plan's economic vision will also require regional grouping of Local Authorities. It is suggested that the regional groups should

undertake an analysis of the dynamics of the commercial and industrial property markets and prepare future economic scenarios based on past trends identifying employment change by sector and land use. With scope to justify local differences, the resultant evidence base is intended to inform mutually consistent economic vision across the regional grouping.

The TAN requires assessment of economic benefits associated with allocating sites and determining planning applications for economic development. Where such an allocation or proposal could raise environmental or social concerns, the TAN proposes an approach posing 3 questions:

- Are there alternative sites for the proposal?
- Hose many direct jobs will result from the proposal?
- Would such a development make a special contribution to policy objectives?

As with all allocations, sites should not be identified if there is little prospect of future development. The TAN also sets out criteria to consider proposals to release existing B1 - B8 sites for other uses.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That Members approve the attached consultation response to the Welsh Government's consultation on Technical Advice Note 23 Economic Development.
